


2019

- The City continues settlement discussions with the other large water users named in cross-complaint to find a "physical solution"
- The City and Channelkeeper come to **interim settlement** that involves actionable **improvement plans** for the River's infrastructure
- The **City moves forward with cross-complaint** believing it vital that a collaborative, enforceable solution be reached among all stakeholders
- In order for the Court to recognize any comprehensive settlement agreement, **State law** requires the City to send out **Notices/Summons** to all who may be impacted



2020

- Notices and Summons go out, as settlement discussions continue
- Because such a large group was included in this notification, communication meetings are being held to make sure all parties understand what is at stake and why this is needed to protect water rights now and in the future





Who received the Notice?

All property owners who own property that overlie (is above) the four groundwater basins in the Ventura River Watershed

Who received the Summons?

All property owners who own property that is next to the Ventura River or its tributaries





What does it mean if I received a Notice?

- You have not been sued
- Your water service will not be interrupted
- City was required to send you the Notice as part of the court process



What does it mean if I received a Summons?


- You have been sued
- You have 60 days to respond if you would like to participate (City is currently seeking 6 month extension)
- Current action won't interrupt service from your current water provider
- City was required to include you as part of the court process



Do I need an Attorney?

- You may wish to consult an attorney:
 - If you currently have a groundwater well
 - Take water from the river
 - Or wish to do so in the future
- The outcome could impact your right to divert, pump or store surface water or groundwater, either now or in the future
- If you do not wish to participate, you can choose to ignore the Notice/Summons





What the City Hopes to Achieve

 Working towards a collaborative solution (settlement) known as a "physical solution"

The City's goal is to work collaboratively to develop a locally driven solution that:

- Avoids State intervention
- Balances river habitat with water needs of region
- Shares the responsibility of protecting this finite water supply among all users
- Develop user group similar to Santa Paula Basin



Legal Fees and Costs


Between **2014-2020** approximately **5 million has been spent** toward legal fees, studies and analyses, and an interim settlement agreement.



As one of the large water users of the River, the City of Ventura has taken the lead on keeping local control for all of its users. It is why the City took on the legal process, which was a necessary step to ensure that a binding, collaborative solution was agreed upon by all water users.
